Transition Day – Tuesday 30th June

Staff and children are looking forward to transition day on Tuesday where everyone will spend a day in their new classes with their new adults. We recognise that the transition to a new year group, in a new space with new adults and in many cases, new classmates, can bring some anxiety. There is a lot of behind the scenes work happening to ensure transition is as smooth as it can possibly be. Current teachers have been meeting with new teachers to pass on key information about each individual child – both academic and pastoral. Before Tuesday, all new teachers will have popped to see their new children in their current classroom to introduce themselves and spend a little time with them. The staff will continue to find these opportunities between now and the end of term to reassure your children as much as possible.

If your child is moving to year 6, they make their way independently round to the year 6 door (by the main office area).

Bike Storage

Please can we remind all children that bikes and scooters must be carefully placed in the bike storage area to ensure there is room for everyone's. No bikes are to be left on the ground at the bottom of the stairs for health and safety reasons.

Arbor
